



We as Freemasons are good men always seeking more enlightenment. As Shriners we have a wonderful Fun organization that allows us to support the Shriners Children's Health Care System of 22 Hospitals and many more Clinics. We are world renowned!

Why don't we have men knocking down our doors to become members then? First, we must make men aware. This is where each of us has the responsibility of reaching out to good men of character when and as often as possible. We must explain what we are and what we stand for. We should enthusiastically explain the wonderful value and benefits we ourselves have received as a Mason and Shriner.

When we gain their interest, we must keep them engaged and show value for a decision to become a Mason and Shriner; always making them feel welcome and important to the Fraternity. We must be always sensitive to whether we are fulfilling the needs and reason for them becoming a part of our Fraternity. What has been important to us may not be their area of interest. Communication is imperative in staying relevant to new members. We may need to adjust some offerings.

So, we have this 100 Goal, but what do we really need to start growth? According to Shriners International we need to have a 5% increase in new members, restore 2%, and keep suspensions below 2%. Monthly Dues Payment Plans

Midian is excited to offer its members the ability to pay dues on-line or select a monthly payment plan for their dues. This is through PayPal and is very secure. You do not need a PayPal account but it's recommended. Please note that the total amount you pay is \$10 a year more than your dues. This is to help pay for the cost of this platform and you can cancel anytime. If you have a PayPal account, enter your email, if you don't click pay with credit card.

There are 5 options to enroll based on your situation. Just go to midianshrine. org and click the "Pay Dues" button to sign up!

OPTION 1: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and current dues are paid. Enrollment time is January through June.

• You will pay \$30 a month for the next 6 months which will pay your next year's dues. After the 1st 6 months of \$30 you will be charged \$15 a month which is applied to your future year's dues.

OPTION 2: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and next year's dues are paid. Enrollment time is June through December.

• You will pay \$15 a month for the next 12 months which will pay your following year's dues. After the 1st 12 months you will continue to be charged \$15 a month which is applied to future dues.

OPTION 3: Stay current on Midian dues. Enroll and pay next year's dues. Enrollment time is June through December.

• You will pay \$180 now plus \$15 a month for the next 12 months which will pay your following year's dues. After the 1st 12 months you will continue to be charged \$15 a month which is applied to your future year's dues.

Option 4: Pay Annual Midian Dues. No Enrollment time. This is a one-time payment and not a subscription.

• You will pay \$180 for one month which will pay your annual dues.

Perpetual Life Membership Payments. Enroll anytime.

- You will pay \$375 now which will pay your dues for the next two years. Then you will pay \$163.09 a month for the next 23 months. This will pay your dues for Perpetual Life.
- Program is non-Refundable.

The featured musician this month is regarded by many as "the Father of Country Music." James Charles Rodgers was born on September 8, 1897 in Meridian, Mississippi. He grew up singing and playing guitar but followed family footsteps in working for the railroad. Finally, he had to choose and music was the

path he chose. Early in his career Rodgers founded a group somewhat like the Dixiekatz. It was not a financial success. Success came as the "Yodeling Brakeman," the "Yodeling Cowboy," "Amerca's Blue Yodeler," carefully adjusted for the

audience he was entertaining. The first generation of Country Music's stars were greatly influenced by his musical style. He left a legacy of songs. One I recall is "In the Jailhouse Now."

Along the way, Jimmie Rodgers reached the rank of Master Mason in Meridian in 1931. Later that year he moved to San Antonio, Texas, where he joined the Scottish Rite. He was also associated with the Alzafar Temple. He died on May 26, 1933 in New York City at the age of 35.




